#### **Remembrance Sunday**

## Oh, Bats!

Many of you will have noticed that the demolition of the Village Hall started rather later than was anticipated. That is all down to these local residents:

One of the conditions of the approval for the re-build from Rushcliffe Borough Council was that an ecological assessment be carried out prior to commencement of work on the site.

A preliminary assessment by an ecology consultant in early July, followed by a bat survey performed at dusk, suggested "some low-level usage by a bat species" with confirmation that the hall "does not contain an active bat roost"



However, when the tiles were removed from the porch area, the two common pipistrelle bats pictured above were seen and removed to safety by the consultant.

Further paperwork relating to the bats ensued, so that demolition could only commence at the start of November. In the meantime, the bats are now relocated to a temporary home and will be returned when bat boxes have been installed into the walls of the new hall.

## **Time Capsule**

Members of the Village Hall Users Committee and other residents have been busy preparing commemorative documents that will be placed in a time capsule to be sited in the new hall, though the exact location has yet to be decided.

The documents cover the initial establishment of the hall, its subsequent history, and the modern-day activities within the hall; these documents have been laser-printed onto archival-quality paper and sealed in special wallets, ready for their insertion into the time capsule.

Details of the capsule 'planting' will be circulated widely on notice boards, social media and the Parish Council website.

Who knows? We might uncover a time capsule from 1922 when the demolition is finished!

## **Grantham Canal – Update**

When the Grantham Canal Water Restoration Group (GCWRG) was established it immediately set out the issues that needed to be resolved to restore water levels to our part of the canal. Not surprisingly, top of the list was the repair of known leaks.

It has taken years of discussion, pressure and publicity, but the serious leaks at Irish Jack's Bridge and near Devil's Elbow have now been repaired.

The work has involved repairing major leakages around the vicinity of Culverts 39 and 42 and Grantham Canal Society, as an approved contractor for The Canal and River Trust, used their volunteer labour to support CART in carrying out this work.

Redundant sheet piling was taken out and the banks excavated to find the voids where water penetration from the canal had successfully made its way into the culverts.



To remedy this situation deep trenches were excavated, in places over 2m deep along the bank side; they were then filled and

compacted with imported puddle clay to form a waterproof barrier to seal the leakages.

60 tonnes of clay was delivered to site from Castle Clay Sales from Stoke on Trent who specialise in providing Puddle Clay to Canal Organisations.



Mechanical excavators and a dumper were hired locally from AE Faulkes at Hickling and GCS volunteers completed the

project working full time in just over a week. A fantastic effort from all those involved.

Recent rainfall has meant that the canal now has water in it and levels are slowly rising, so it looks promising. GCWRG will continue to monitor the levels but, in truth, it won't be until next year until we have a clear idea of how effective this is or if there are other leaks we are not aware of.

Fingers crossed!

In the meantime, GCWRG turns its attention to two other priority areas, ie clearing reeds and blockages to allow the water to flow down the canal to our area, and maximising the feeds that are essential to maintain levels.

Plans are already coming together to clear reeds along the canal to create a four-metre-wide corridor. GCWRG is then looking at ways to get volunteers to widen the corridor further and keep it clear in certain places by pulling reeds by hand. It will be hard, smelly work but well worth the end result. Work is also underway to understand the recently rebuilt canal feed coming out of the Knipton Reservoir and to clear the 5km feed as it passes through open ditches and 200-year-old brick culverts. This feed is vital to our part of the canal and, in fact, it is the only reason that Knipton Reservoir was built in the first place. The reservoir and a large part of the feed are on Belvoir Estate land, so the assistance of the Estate is vital to this work and GCS will, again be carrying out some, if not all, of this work.

GCWRG is also, with the support of Rushcliffe Borough Council and local MPs, pushing to have the canal reclassified from a 'remainder waterway' and instead to be considered as a health and leisure corridor used by thousands daily, and to be funded accordingly.

GCWRG continues to raise funds – including a recent generous donation of £300 from the Hickling Scarecrow weekend and the Mayor, Cllr Tina Combellack, one of the founder members of our group, has made GCWRG one of her two chosen charities to help raise funds for our valued waterway. We will be using these funds to support these projects and anything that will raise and maintain water levels in our section of the canal.

Finally, GCWRG is in close contact with the Lady Bay local group who are rightly concerned that their stretch of canal recently dried up suddenly, and we will continue to offer advice and support as they set out on a similar path, and GCS and CRT are similarly involved to resolve issues at that end of the canal.

It has been a long, slow process but we are at last making progress and gaining momentum, and GCWRG is grateful to our partners Grantham Canal Society and Canal and River Trust and to Rushcliffe Borough Council for helping to get this far and, of course, to you for your support along the way.

## Sky Divers Raise Money for Children's Bereavement Centre

NEWARK BLUE LIGHT BUSINESS TAKES TO THE SKIES TO RAISE £6,000 FOR CHILDREN'S BEREAVEMENT CENTRE - AND THEY AIM TO RAISE EVEN MORE!

Newark Blue Light business Motorfinity has taken to the skies to raise important funds for The Children's Bereavement Centre.

Colleagues at the Northern Road car specialist company - which offers discounted vehicles for those in the emergency services, NHS, social care sector and armed forces - have raised £5,848 so far by skydiving from 14,000 feet at Skydive Langar, and aim to raise even more when more of their team jump this coming weekend.

The Children's Bereavement Centre is based on King's Road, Newark, and provides support to young people experiencing trauma or loss. The money raised by the group at Motorfinity will support the Centre's ongoing work and development.



Dean Skiba is the Chief Operating Officer at Motorfinity and he made his skydive on Monday.



Speaking of the experience, he said:

"I have always dreamed of doing a tandem skydive

and doing it for such a worthy course was a truly special experience.

The Children's Bereavement Centre provides support to children, young people and their families that are experiencing trauma due to the death or terminal illness of a loved one.

The experience was totally mind blowing, words cannot describe it. It's certainly up there as one of the most exhilarating, fun, and scary things ever! I am beyond proud of myself and the money raised for The Children's Bereavement Centre."



Debi Fechete was the tandem instructor for Dean on the day. She said:

"As a tandem

instructor, I'm fortunate to meet so many amazing people raising money for incredible causes and this was no different. Dean and Daniel were a pleasure to share the skies with and we're looking forward to meeting more of the Motorfinity team in the future."

Rachel Wilson is the fundraising manager at The Children's Bereavement Centre. She commented:

"We are delighted that Team Motorfinity have decided to take on this amazing challenge to support us and have found working with them an absolute pleasure They are enthusiastic, passionate and really committed to achieve the very best results they can. I know some of the group are very nervous but they are doing it anyway and really stepping outside of



their comfort zone.

"The funds they raise from this activity will enable

us to be there to support local children, young people and their families through one of the most devastating times in their lives. Motorfinity are making it possible for us to change the lives of local families. On behalf of all the team at the CBC a heartfelt thank you, to everyone taking part and all their colleagues, family and friends that have supported them."

Motorfinity has been supporting The Children's Bereavement Centre for 2 years and other fundraising activities have included supporting the Dragon Boat Festival in 2021 and 2022, this year entering two teams into the racing and becoming an event sponsor by organising a carnival area on site for the general public to enjoy. They have also provided prizes to be used in raffles to raise funds and items that the children can use in their sessions.

A further six colleagues will take part in tandem skydives next spring for CBC.

## Langar Team Wins Gold in Skydiving National Championships

A team from Langar in Nottinghamshire has won gold in the British National Skydiving Championships. 'Chimera' beat the silver medallists by 40 points in total to be named the top 4-way formation



skydiving team in the country.

The win happened over the weekend,

with nearly 30 teams competing for the title. Chimera will be attending the World Skydiving Championships in Eloy, Arizona in October 2022 where they will represent Great Britain.

Speaking of the win, Laura Hampton, who holds the position of 'outside centre' in Chimera, said:

"It's been an incredible journey and we are so proud of what we've been able to achieve. It's been a long road to this point, and we've had ups and downs along the way; to come out victorious this weekend was a genuine dream come true for us all.

"We look forward to using our new title to inspire other people to try skydiving and to learn formation skydiving in particular."

The team comprises five members -Laura Hampton (Bingham), James Woods (Harby), Sarah Ashworth (Harby), Will Cooke (Langar) and Pete Harries (Cotgrave) - with the four 'performers' holding on to each other to create shapes, or formations, and one camera flyer responsible for capturing the skydive using a camera mounted to their helmet.

Chimera regularly trains at Skydive Langar, around 20 minutes outside of Nottingham. They expect to continue their training here in the run-up to the world meet.

A number of teams from Skydive Langar attended the competition, including Silver Linings, Alola, Eros, Winged Hussars, L3, DNF and Spread Eagles. The centre aims to be a centre for training excellence and has increased the amount of coaching available to skydiving teams in recent years.

Skydiving in the UK has grown significantly in popularity in recent years, with many citing the so-called 'experience economy' and the lockdowns as the reason for people seeking a new, exhilarating challenge.

Skydive Langar is the biggest and busiest skydiving centre in the UK,



completing around 40,000 skydives per year, with typically 10% of those being

tandem jumps and the rest being sports jumpers, including students from the University of Nottingham.

## Langar and Barnstone Wildflower Area

Over the past couple of years the grassy area around the Langar/Barnstone crossroads has been producing a beautiful display of cowslips, so your Parish Council has decided to further develop the area into a wild flower area.

The idea will be to make the entrance to Langar and Barnstone look nicer with lots of wild flowers and to reduce the number of times that we need to cut the grass, saving money as well.

## Village Bedding Displays

In addition to the wild flower displays mentioned above, we were contacted by Carol Courtney, a resident from Barnstone who is carrying out studies with the RHS and, as part of her studies, she is required to work within her community to look at community bedding.

After visiting areas within the village, Carol decided to help the Parish Council by improving the village planters around the play park area and bringing them back to life by replanting them with some new plants which are more drought-resistant.

With that in mind Carol visited some of the gardens around the villages with a view to collecting some plants that can be separated and transplanted in the spring.


