The Latest from your Parish Council

Welcome to the 2024 Autumn issue of the Signpost Magazine.

Published quarterly by the Langar cum Barnstone Parish Council, the magazine is delivered to every house and business in Langar and Barnstone. The magazines are delivered by parish councillors and employees.

Inside the magazine you will find information on up-and-coming events, plus reports on recent local events and issues.

The magazine is published to keep everyone informed about what is happening around the area and it can also be sent out electronically.

If you would like to add anything to forthcoming issues of the magazine or if you feel we are missing some important information, then please contact the Parish Clerk and she will raise the issues at the next Parish Council meeting.

The Parish Council meets in the community hall on the second Thursday of every month at 1930 and it is attended wherever possible by all the Parish Councillors, the local Rushcliffe and County Council elected representatives, and the Rushcliffe Police Beat Managers.

The beginning of each session is given over to anyone who wishes to raise an issue.

We have welcomed two new members of the council Cllr Rich Brooks and Cllr Lee Whatton and they have just completed their training. We still have vacancies if anyone wishes to give their support.

We must report that recently the children's play area in Barnstone has been vandalised. Some of the damage to the slide was caused by knives slicing the siding area and was potentially quite dangerous.

The area is going to require a lot of repairs which must be paid for by the Parish Council and while we are waiting for quotes to repair, some of the units have been roped off with red tape.

We would ask parents to be vigilant especially when they take young children to the area. We have received a grant to facilitate the repairing of the fence around the area which has needed repair for some time.

We have asked for the speed restrictions on the road into Langar from Cropwell Bishop to be extended past the entrance to Langar hall following a recent accident in the area.

We have also reported many potholes on the roads in the area as well as the excessive mud on the road out of Barnstone towards Granby.

A meeting was held in September between the Trustee and the regular users of the new community hall following the first nine months of usage of the hall.

At the meeting an update on the current situation in the hall was presented.

Since opening, the hall has continued to be booked by many of the regular users of the old hall. There are plenty of new regular users including groups such as Yoga, Good Grief Dear and Dave Williams' Singing Group.

In addition, we are pleased that several groups have booked individual events including Vale Ventures, and a Comedy Night was held which was attended by 100 people.

Many parties have been held including christenings, wedding anniversaries and children's parties where small bouncy castles were hired in.

The small meeting room can be booked separately and this has been used by local businesses to hold company meetings.

The hall has capacity for up to 100 seated with tables and chairs along with a new stage which can be

assembled for use, and a fully fitted kitchen for cooking for an event.

We have had some lovely comments from one-off users saying how much they enjoyed using the new hall.

Time slots are still available for either one-off users or regular repeat events.

The Parish Clerk is advertising locally to attract more users to the hall which will all add to the continued sustainability of this lovely village facility.

The Vale Market Café continues to hold its monthly Saturday morning event, and it is now attended by local Police Beat Managers and local councillors. They hold local surgeries where they are available for private chats if required.

October's meeting was also attended by Vale First Responders who are hoping to be regular visitors.

You will read elsewhere in the magazine that the Parish Council has successfully obtained a grant to run a warm space weekly event during the cold winter weeks where anyone can attend to chat with friends etc in a warm lovely environment.

Officially our membership is at 25 members. This is really very good and we have members from all over the area. The diversity of those members is quite something too.

Painting, yes of course, but watercolours, acrylics and pencil. We also have needle artists, cross-stitching and embroidery, weaving and knitting.

This brings me to a new art form which was demonstrated to us by Harriet Morley. Most of you will have seen her owl on the front page of the Village Link. Felt is Harriet's medium and she can make it sing. She makes pictures in felt on felt and that felt is made by her to the specification of the item she is making.

She also does sculptures of the tiniest things, Halloween items like pumpkins, Christmas baubles – robins, snowmen. Harriet then showed us how to blend wool together by using a barbed needle to make all her sculptures.

To make a picture however, this item is made by pulling and laying mohair, placing it on a plastic mat into the shape required, making it several layers thick, spraying it with soapy water to bond it, then using another plastic mat and a rolling pin.

This mat was to be the base for a picture she was doing for herself, but it demonstrated to us how she does everything from scratch.

A colourful green/blue compacted mat was the result of the layering and then once achieved she adds further pieces to make the picture.

Thank you so much Harriet for a very interesting afternoon.

The Science Behind Singing

There are some fabulous health benefits from both singing and being around music that are good for physical as well as mental well-being.

Have you ever sung with a group and wondered why it feels so good? Singing in a group, all singing the same song, releases endorphins and positive feelings to those in the group. There is an element of cooperation and trust that the tune will not stop or defer away. This helps build rapport and friendship with others.


Listening to music releases oxytocin. Oxytocin reduces the amount of cortisol which is released when stressed. Not only does oxytocin reduce stress and discomfort levels, but it also increases levels of trust with others. The sacculus in the inner ear also releases endorphins when stimulated, it is stimulated by low tones

and loud music, so encourage your lower tones to sing along too (this explains why your favourite music is better listened to when loud!)

When hearing music, different areas of the brain become active, including motor, visual and audio. It improves cognitive ability and development. The ability to recall information can be improved with the recall of tunes and lyrics. Singing with a group can build concentration skills as you focus on keeping time, varying the pitch or adding movement.

The act of dancing and moving goes hand in hand with music and singing, improving motor skills, rhythm and activity. Singing out loud can increase lung capacity and stamina as well as working muscles including the heart.

It does not matter if you can't hold a tune, just sing; your body and mind will reap the benefits!



Despite it being a wet Summer, it has been a busy season for Belvoir Archers. We have either been taking part in or hosting several archer competitions as well as the normal club shooting on Tuesday and Thursday evenings and Saturday afternoon



As well as running two beginners' courses and several taster seasons, we have held our

four tournaments: 321 Shoot in June, 720 in July and our Summer and Winter Windsors in August and the start of October. We have had entries from all over the country including from a former two-time Olympian.

We were lucky that the rain held off for most of our competitions until the end of the presentation.

Belvoir Archers hosted several World Record Status Crossbow shoots which were attended by Arbalists from all over the UK

Our Longbow archer, Scott Watton, had an amazing season. (Scott is in the middle of the back line of the photo).



Scott became the Nottinghamshire County Longbow Champion as well as the East Midlands Archery Society Longbow Champion. He was part of the winning Nottinghamshire Longbow team in the Inter Counties Championships in September. Scott was also the highest scoring Longbow archer in the interregional shoot East Midlands v West Midlands which East Midlands won.



As the winter season approaches: Belvoir Archers will move inside to the Community Hall where we shoot on Tuesday and

Thursday evenings and alternative Saturday. We will be out on the field on Saturdays when we are not in the Community Hall.

We have a number of shoots coming up with a the St Crispin tournament for Belvoir Archer members as well as our Boxing Day shoot.

Charity Skydive Raises £70,000 in One Day for Landslide Victims in India

A charity has raised over £70,000 in ONE DAY by skydiving out of planes at 14,000 feet over Nottinghamshire, all in aid of landslide victims in south India.



The British
Malayali Charity,
which has been
running for 12
years and has
raised £1.3
million since its
incorporation,
invited
supporters to join
them for a day of

tandem skydiving at Skydive Langar, where 27 adventurers and their families headed to make their jumps on Sunday 8 September 2024.

The jumpers travelled from far and wide, including Nottingham, Leicester, Manchester and Belfast, with one skydiver - Mr. Shajan Skariah, the Managing Editor of the leading online



news Marunadan Malayali - travelling all the way from India to take part.

Speaking of their achievement, Shri Shajan Scaria, who is the founder and patron of the British Malayali Charity, said: "It's an incredible feat and we're so grateful to everyone who came out to



support our cause. People in southern India are in such desperate need after the landslide which killed a lot of people, leaving many young people destitute and without any financial support to cover even their living costs.

"We wanted to do something big which shows our support while raising as much money as possible to help the people of India. It's amazing to see so many people coming out to take part or just to cheer the skydivers on. Thank you to everyone who has donated and of course thank you to Skydive Langar for helping us to make it happen."

Keeley Titterton is the charity skydive coordinator at Skydive Langar, who worked with the charity's founders to arrange the skydiving day. She said:

"We welcome many charity skydivers here at Langar and we're always impressed to see how much they've been able to raise and the range of worthy causes they support.

"The British Malayali Charity was a pleasure to work with and we thoroughly enjoyed having them here at the airfield and jumping with them. We're so pleased the sun was shining for them and wish them all the very

best with their ongoing fundraising efforts."

An emergency appeal was launched in August 2024 after a landslide disaster struck Kerala, India, killing over 500 people and leaving villages and homes in disrepair. Many of the Malayali community in the UK hail from Kerala, so they moved quickly to raise much needed funds to support the communities back home.

The funds raised may be used for rehabilitation purposes for the families who lost their near and dear ones, their houses and all their assets including cash and crops.

The group aims to raise £100,000 in total by the end of the month and have



pledged a portion of the funds to support Alzheimer's Society UK.

Skydive Langar is the UK's biggest skydiving centre, welcoming thousands of tandem skydivers every year, plus

The Grantham Canal



Autumn days on the Grantham Canal. (CRT). It's

been a crazy summer, work and weather wise. Hopefully we are moving into calmer waters.

Water levels in the Grantham Canal at Hickling and Kinoulton are disastrously low and causing concern. Below is the latest report sent from GCS:

'The Knipton Feeder has been turned off for most of the summer pending repairs to Culvert 12 at Muston. The consequence of this is there is not a water feed into the canal below Lock 12.

In addition GCS are carrying out urgent repairs to Locks 18-16 and so stop planks are in place just above Lock 18 which reduce the flow from the summit pound. Hopefully we will have completed this work within the next month.

The summit pound is also low as the feeder from Denton has been reduced to combat the blue green algae from encroaching into the canal. The feed into Denton Reservoir is also reduced because of a lack of rainfall.

This was disappointing news for GSWRG (Grantham Canal Water Restoration Group) as we seemed to have made such progress in restoring our water with work completed on the Knipton feeder and Reed Clearance. Hopefully this is only a temporary drought'.

Hickling Scarecrow Weekend – every year it is a great success. Amazing street entertainment, traditional fair ground attractions, vintage tractors and Lancaster fly past on both days and of course wonderful Scarecrows. Grateful thanks to absolutely everyone in the village who made this happen. The main charity this year was the Homeless charity, Emmanuel House.

Broadband and Mobile Signals

Kinoulton and Colston Bassett are very fortunate in being able to take advantage of the County Council scheme to help with the installation of Full Fibre Broadband, however villages such as Hickling and Upper Broughton on the Notts/Leicestershire border are not so lucky. Once again if you can let me know any issues you experience with regard to Broadband and mobile signals it will help in providing evidence of the lack of or poor quality of service.

NCC will be providing me with an update, following scrutiny of this matter

by Rushcliffe. They are currently awaiting further information from suppliers and BDUK. They commented:

'I note your point about the challenges facing "border" areas which in terms of Project Gigabit has been defined by BDUK who originally felt that the Local Area boundaries were not something they should be constrained by and have therefore resorted to old style Openreach Exchange boundaries.'

New fibre does not necessarily have to conform to the Openreach Exchange areas.

Traffic Calming and Parking Schemes

Parish Councils are looking into traffic calming schemes and Colston Bassett, with the aid of their County Councillor, were successful in getting an extension of their 40mph zone on Hall Lane. They are now researching village gateways.

They have also successfully taken advantage of the speed watch scheme, as have Langar cum Barnstone. Cllr Cottee has been helping Upper Broughton to get parking restrictions in place on the A606 which is very dangerous around the bends near the pub.

Flooding - drain clearance programme ahead of the winter

Following a visit to Kinoulton by Via and Cllr Richard Butler, the County Council are bringing forward a programme of gully clearance in the area, ahead of the winter, to ease the problem of street flooding.

Rushcliffe have for several years implemented a programme of tree planting, but with that comes the consequence of leaf build up in Autumn.

Therefore, If you see gullies and drains filling up with leaves perhaps you could help keep them clear – every little helps and could stop a flood.

Domestic Abuse

Rushcliffe is continuing to protect residents from domestic abuse.

As well as the ASK FOR ANGELA campaign being promoted in pubs in West Bridgford, town and rural parishes, we are now promoting SAFE SPACES in Rushcliffe shops.

You will be seeing signs, similar to the one below, going up in shop windows as the scheme is rolled out

Silent Solution Steps From a Mobile

- 1. Dial 999
- Wait until the call is answered then stay silent
- 3. The call will then go to an operator where you can press 55
- The system will detect this and the operator will transfer the call to the relevant police force as an emergency

Silent Solution Steps From a Landline

- 1. Dial 999
- 2. Stay silent and you will then be connected to a police call handler

When 999 calls are made from landlines, information about where you're calling from should be automatically available to the call handlers to help provide a response.

If you replace the handset, the landline may remain connected for 45 seconds in case you pick it up again.
